Parish Office Phone: (708) 460-0042 Fax: (708)460-0136 The Funeral Mass expresses faith in Jesus' victory over death and our personal share in resurrection. It does so through prayers and blessings, through songs and readings, through ceremonies and symbols. A few words on some of these may make the liturgy more understandable and more consoling.

The color of the priest's vestments. We normally associate the color white with Easter, weddings, baptisms and other events of joy, happiness and victory. Since we are not merely grieving over a loved one's loss, but celebrating his or her entrance through death into life forever, the priest generally wears white vestments.

- **The Easter or paschal candle.** For 50 days after Easter the large paschal candle stands in the sanctuary. It symbolizes the risen Christ and tells us he has conquered sin and death and now lives in our midst. We carry this candle in procession or place it before the casket or cremains as a reminder that the deceased, through his or her death, shares in that victory of Jesus over the powers of darkness.
- **Sprinkling of the casket or cremains.** We first share in the resurrection of the Lord through baptism. At the font, saving waters poured over our bodies made us Christians and our whole beings new creations filled with the Holy Spirit. When the priest sprinkles holy water over the casket or cremains it should serve to recall that

initial washing in baptism. It is this which gives us the basis for hope in the personal rising of loved ones to life forever.

- **Placement of the Pall:** The Pall (white cloth reminiscent of Baptism) may be placed on the casket or cremains by family members if you so choose. Please notify the funeral home if this is your desire.
- Scripture Selections: Once you have read the Scripture passages, you will need to select a First Reading from the Old Testament section, and a Second Reading from the New Testament section. We encourage you to select two family members/friends to proclaim the readings at the liturgy. The Celebrant will select and read the Gospel Reading.
- **Prayers of the Faithful:** See page 48 for a sample of General Intercessions. They may be used as-is, adapted or written to your particular circumstances. A family member may present these petitions.
- **Gifts:** 2 cruets of wine and water along with a ciborium of hosts are brought up to the priest. Two/three people are asked to bring up the gifts.
- **Incensing of the body.** As Christians we believe the body is a temple of the Holy Spirit and one day will be resurrected by God's mighty power. During the Funeral Mass, the priest walks around the casket or cremains and incenses the

body as a sign of our respect for the remains, as a symbol of the community's prayers for the deceased rising to the throne of God, and as a final farewell.

The final commendation and committal. The last ceremony after Mass and at the cemetery is called a Liturgy of Final Farewell or Commendation and Committal. In some ways, this is the most difficult time, for it is a final good-bye to one we have loved through life. Our separation, our faith tells us, is but a temporary one. The following prayer, one of several which concludes the service, summarizes these thoughts:

Our brother/sister N. has gone to his/her rest in the peace of Christ.

May the Lord now welcome him/her to the table of God's children in heaven.

With faith and hope in eternal life, let us assist Him/her with our prayers.

Let us pray to the Lord also for ourselves. May we who mourn be reunited one day with our brother/sister; together may we meet Christ Jesus when he who is our life appears in glory.

Liturgical Concerns:

- Music: A parish vocalist/cantor will be provided to sing at the liturgy. Only hymns and songs appropriate to the structure of the liturgy will be considered. Secular pieces, even if they are the request of the decedent, may be best suited to the wake service. Final approval of all songs is to be determined by the Director of Music. See page 47 for suggested hymns.
- **Eulogies:** The practice of eulogizing the decedent should take place outside the liturgy. Often, it undermines the homily, and puts the emphasis on personal grief. It is suggested that this be done at the wake service. If there is to be a eulogy, it is to be delivered by one person and be three to five minutes in length. It takes place after Communion.
- **Cremation:** If the decedent is to be cremated, following the funeral liturgy, St. Francis of Assisi will adhere to the same mass protocol. If the decedent is cremated prior to the liturgy, Mass can be celebrated (with the remains present) provided they are placed on a table in front of the church, but not on the altar. Provisions must be made for the interment of the remains._ <u>Interment is a requirement of the Church,</u> <u>and Completes the Rite of Burial.</u>
- **Memorial Services:** In the event of a parish Memorial Service, St. Francis of Assisi Parish will adhere to the same mass protocol. Memorial displays (collages, etc.) will be placed in the narthex at the entrance to church. Pictures or other displays may not be placed on the altar.

OLD TESTAMENT READINGS

- Select 1 from the following readings

Job, who has been afflicted with terrible sufferings does not give in to despair but proclaims, "I know my Vindicator (God) lives." Even in suffering God hasn't let Job down.

1. Job 19: 1, 23-27

A reading from the book of Job

Job answered and said:

Oh, would that my words were written down Would that they were inscribed in a record:

That with an iron chisel and with lead they were cut in the rock forever!

But as for me, I know that my Vindicator lives, and that he will at last stand forth upon the dust. I will see for myself, my own eyes, not another's, will behold him:

And from my flesh I shall see God; my inmost being is consumed with longing.

It may seem that those who die are punished by God. But not so. King Solomon says God's care is "with his elect."

A reading from the book of the prophet Daniel

- At that time your people shall escape, everyone who is found written in the book.
- Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake;
- Some to everlasting life,

- She girds herself with strength; she exerts her arms with vigor.

NEW TESTAMENT READINGS

God has appointed Jesus to judge everyone, alive or dead.

1. Longer Form, Acts 10: 34-43

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Then Peter proceeded to speak and said,

"In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him. You know the word he sent to the Israelites as he proclaimed peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all, what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name."

2. Shorter form, Acts 10: 34-36, 42-43

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

Brothers and Sisters

Hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the holy Spirit that has been given to us. For Christ, while we were still helpless, yet died at the appointed time for the ungodly. Indeed, only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us. How much more then, since we are now justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath. Indeed, if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, how much more, once reconciled, will we be saved by his life. Not only that, but we also boast of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

Let us walk in newness of life.

4. Longer form, Romans 6:3-9

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

Brothers and Sisters:

- Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life.
- For if we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection. We know that our old self was crucified with him, so that our sinful body might be done away with, that we might no longer be in slavery to sin. For a dead person has been absolved from sin. If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him.

5. Shorter form, Romans 6: 3-4,8-9

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

Brothers and sisters:

- Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life.
- If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him.

The sufferings of the present are nothing compared to the glory to be revealed in us through Jesus.

6. Romans 8: 14-23

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

Brothers and sisters:

For those who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a spirit of adoption, through which we cry, "Abba, Father!" The Spirit itself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if only we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him. I consider that the sufferings of this present time are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for us. For creation awaits with eager expectation the revelation of the children of God; for creation was made subject to futility, not of its own accord but because of the one who subjected it, in hope that creation itself would be set free from slavery to corruption and share in the glorious freedom of the children of God. We know that all creation is groaning in labor pains even until now; and not only that, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, we also groan within ourselves as we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies.

Who can ever come between us and the love of Christ?

7. Romans 8: 31b-35, 37-39

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

Brothers and sisters:

If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us all, how will he not also give us everything else along with him? Who will bring a charge against God's chosen ones? It is God who acquits us. Who will condemn? It is Christ [Jesus] who died, rather, was raised, who also is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. What will separate us from the love of Christ? Will anguish, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or the sword? No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Whether alive or dead we are the Lord's All belong to the Lord.

8. Romans 14: 7-12

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

Brothers and sisters:

- None of us lives for oneself, and no one dies for oneself. For if we live, we live for the Lord, and if we die, we die for the Lord; so then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. For this is why Christ died and came to life, that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living. Why then do you judge your brother? Or you, why do you look down on your brother? For we shall all stand before the judgment seat of God; for it is written:
- "As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bend before me, and every tongue shall give praise to God." So [then] each of us shall give an account of himself [to God].

9.1 Cor 13:1-13

- A reading from the First letter of Paul to the Corinthians
- If I speak in human and angelic tongues but do not have love, I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal. And if I have the gift of prophecy and comprehend all mysteries and all knowledge; if I have all faith so as to move mountains but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away everything I own, and if I hand my body over so that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing.
- Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, [love] is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.
- Love never fails. If there are prophecies, they will be brought to nothing; if tongues, they will cease; if knowledge, it will be brought to nothing. For we know partially and we prophesy partially, but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away. When I was a child, I used to talk as a child, think as a child, reason as a child; when I became a man, I put aside childish things. At present we see indistinctly, as in a mirror, but then face to face. At present I know partially; then I shall know fully, as I am fully known. So, faith, hope, love remain, these three; but the greatest of these is love. The Word of the Lord.

All people will be brought to life in Christ

10. Longer form, 1 Cor 15: 20-28

A reading from the First letter of Paul to the Corinthians

Brothers and sisters:

But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead came also through a human being. For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order: Christ the first fruits; then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ; then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to his God and Father, when he has destroyed every sovereignty and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death, for "he subjected everything under his feet." But when it says that everything has been subjected, it is clear that it excludes the one who subjected everything to him. When everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will [also] be subjected to the one who subjected everything to him, so that God may be all in all.

11. Shorter Form, 1 Cor 15: 20-23

A reading from the First letter of Paul to the Corinthians

Brothers and sisters:

Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead came also through a human being. For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order: Christ the first fruits; then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ.

Death is swallowed up in victory

12. 1 Cor 15: 51-57

A reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians

Brothers and sisters:

- Behold, I tell you a mystery. We shall not all fall asleep, but we will all be changed, in an instant, in the blink of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. For that which is corruptible must clothe itself with incorruptibility, and that which is mortal must clothe itself with immortality. And when this which is corruptible clothes itself with incorruptibility and this which is mortal clothes itself with immortality, then the word that is written shall come about: "Death is swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God who gives us the
 - victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

13. 2 Cor 4: 14 – 5:1

A reading from the Second letter of Paul to the Corinthians

Brothers and sisters:

Knowing that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and place us with you in his presence. Everything indeed is for you, so that the grace bestowed in abundance on more and more people may cause the thanksgiving to overflow for the glory of God.
Therefore, we are not discouraged; rather, although our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this momentary light affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to what is seen but to what is unseen; for what is seen is transitory, but what is unseen is eternal.
For we know that if our earthly dwelling, a tent,

For we know that if our earthly dwelling, a tent, should be destroyed, we have a building from God, a dwelling not made with hands, eternal in heaven.

We have an everlasting home in heaven.

14. 2 Cor 5:1, 6-10

A reading from the Second letter of Paul to the Corinthians

Brothers and sisters:

- For we know that if our earthly dwelling, a tent, should be destroyed, we have a building from God, a dwelling not made with hands, eternal in heaven.
- So, we are always courageous, although we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, for we walk by faith, not by sight. Yet we are courageous, and we would rather leave the body and go home to the Lord. Therefore, we aspire to please him, whether we are at home or away. For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil.

Our citizenship is in heaven.
