Gospel in everyday English

After John was arrested, Jesus went to Galilee preaching the Message of God: "Time's up! God's kingdom is here. Change your life and believe the Message." Passing along the beach of Lake Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew net-fishing. Fishing was their regular work. Jesus said to them, "Come with me. I'll make a new kind of fisherman out of you. I'll show you how to catch men and women instead of perch and bass." They didn't ask questions. They dropped their nets and followed.

A dozen yards or so down the beach, he saw the brothers James and John, Zebedee's sons. They were in the boat, mending their fishnets. Right off, he made the same offer. Immediately, they left their father Zebedee, the boat, and the hired hands, and followed (*from Mark 1*).

Notes on the Scripture

I have been watching some NFL play-off games and have been impressed with some great teams. Usually, if you want to accomplish big goals, you want to assemble the best team possible. However, there are many examples of teams loaded with the best players failing miserably. The most talented or gifted people are not always the right people. Chemistry, attitude, and desire are all components necessary in building a winning team.

We are led to believe that some of those Jesus called to be apostles were not the most talented or smartest people for the job, but they were the right choices. Scripture has these men denying, doubting, and questioning Jesus. But a movement that spread around the world and became the church was founded on such as these.

God calls each of us to play our part in his plan. We are called from wealth and poverty, from experience and simplicity, and from community and solitude. In him there is no Greek or Jew, male or female, slave or free. Each of us is called to be a part, and without any one of us, our ability to fulfill that plan is diminished. Call us stewards, disciples, or followers. But whatever name you use, we are all called.

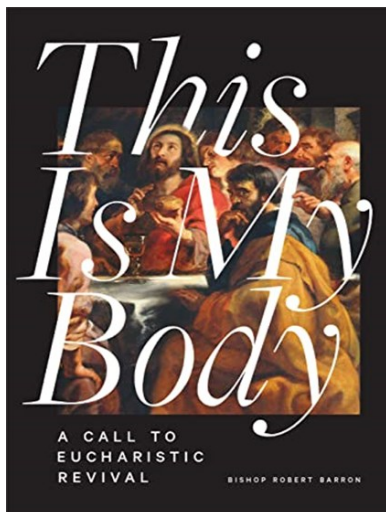

My Experience at NCYC 2023

My name is Delaney Johnson, and I was very fortunate to attend this year's National Catholic Youth Conference with Fr. Jay and other members of St. Francis. My experience at NCYC was amazing and it allowed me to get out of my comfort zone and experience my faith in a completely new and exciting way. I was originally hesitant to join the journey to Indianapolis for the conference, but I am so glad that I went. From the start, the entire city of Indianapolis was filled with Catholic teens, and you could just feel the excitement around you. Everyone was wearing fun hats and laughing with other members of their parish, and I knew that my time at NCYC was going to be great.

When we first arrived at our hotel, we settled in and went to church. I had never been to a completely full mass of almost all teenagers and the mass felt unreal. It was incredible to see so many kids my age so deep in their faith. After mass, we went to our first group session at the Lucas Oil Stadium and when I walked in, I was not expecting what was to come next. From the second we found our seats amongst the 13,000 Catholics, the whole stadium was filled with joy. Everyone was singing and praising God. It was so new to see that many people praising all together. Singing and dancing with all of the other people really pushed me out of my comfort zone. I was not used to expressing my faith so freely.

Each day we had two group sessions, breakout sessions, and went to mass. After the first group session, everyone would split up with their parishes and go to the breakout sessions that they were interested in. Each breakout would be filled with different topics about the Catholic faith, and it was interesting to hear different takes and advice on the topics. Many of the breakout sessions that I went to were very moving and helped me enrich my faith and see new perspectives. In between each breakout, people would pin clothespins with encouraging messages on you and your accessories, and it was so nice to read those messages after a long day.

Throughout my experience at NCYC, I was able to learn about my faith, make stronger connections with the people from my parish, and really open up about my struggles and thoughts about my faith and daily life. I loved every moment of my time at NCYC and strongly encourage other teens to join the next NCYC journey.





The “Angel Fund”

Each year, across the nation, Catholic schools are recognized at parish masses and with special school events during “Catholic Schools Week.” This year, the celebration for our parish school, **Cardinal Joseph Bernardin Catholic School (CJB)**, will begin with liturgies on January 27 and 28. CJB staff and students will also welcome visitors for our Open House and Personal Tours on **January 28 from 11am until 1pm**. Throughout “Catholic Schools Week” special events will be held at CJB – beginning with a mass on January 29 which will recognize and celebrate our volunteers. Additionally, we will celebrate the strong program of faith formation at CJB, our nationally twice-recognized blue-ribbon academics, and the selfless involvement of students and staff in a variety of service projects.

Nine years ago, CJB’s founding parishes (St. Elizabeth Seton, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Stephen Deacon & Martyr, and St. Julie Billiart) began a special collection known as the “**Angel Fund**.” This collection is taken up one weekend during the year at the start of Catholic Schools Week. The Angel Fund is meant to assist parishioner families who may need a bit of help in sending their children to CJB. Last year, nearly 20% of our students received some type of financial aid from various sources. As you would understand, many families are in need.

CJB is so very grateful to our sponsoring parishes who subsidize qualified parishioner students. With the recent defeat in the Illinois House of the extension of the *Invest in Kids Program*, our school will lose over \$40,000 in tuition assistance for current students who hope to attend CJB next year. **No donation is too small. Any donation you are able to make is truly appreciated! This special collection will take place, in person, during the weekend of January 27 and 28. 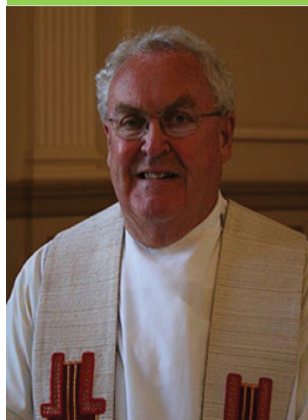

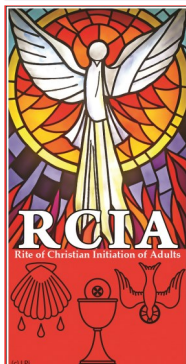
