Gospel in everyday English

Then they entered Capernaum. When the Sabbath arrived, Jesus lost no time in getting to the meeting place. He spent the day there teaching. They were surprised at his teaching—so forthright, so confident—not quibbling and quoting like the religion scholars.

Suddenly, while still in the meeting place, he was interrupted by a man who was deeply disturbed and yelling out, “What business do you have here with us, Jesus? Nazarene! I know what you’re up to! You’re the Holy One of God, and you’ve come to destroy us!”

Jesus shut him up: “Quiet! Get out of him!” The afflicting spirit threw the man into spasms, protesting loudly—and got out. Everyone there was incredulous, buzzing with curiosity. “What’s going on here? A new teaching that does what it says? He shuts up defiling, demonic spirits and sends them packing!” News of this traveled fast and was soon all over Galilee (*from Mark 1*).

Notes on the Scripture

Mark wrote his Gospel to instruct us about the Teacher. He knew that even those disciples who left everything behind had a long road ahead of them before they would understand just what it was that Jesus of Nazareth would do with them. Perhaps the challenge of today is not so much to make a new commitment, but to let our hearts be shaken. Rereading the Gospel of Mark, we are invited to look again at Jesus the Teacher who put every word of his preaching into action.

“I Am the Living Bread which Came Down from Heaven” Several conversations amongst Small Faith Group participants were started with the question: Where in the Bible did Jesus tell us about the real presence of His Body and Blood?

In John 6:51 Jesus says “I am the living bread which came down from Heaven; If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. Truly, I say to you unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in you.” Although the Eucharistic Revival Small Faith Groups are not a Bible Study Program, reading the Gospel of John, Chapter 6 is a great place for anyone to read Jesus’ words regarding the Eucharist. The following are the thoughts of two of your fellow parishioners who attended a Small Faith Group.

Jackie Guilbeau In a world filled with darkness, distractions and temptations, hosting a Small Faith Group gave me an opportunity to focus on the Church’s teachings around the Sacrament of the Eucharist and to prioritize my relationship with Jesus. It was helpful to spend time discussing the fact that the Eucharist is not just a symbol. It is Jesus’ eternal sacrifice. His miraculous, lifegiving presence from Heaven during the consecration is

made visible at each and every Mass we celebrate! We also learned that the regular consumption of the Body and Blood of Christ readies us for eternal life.

One participant commented that she never fully realized the role of the Father and the Holy Spirit in this miracle. The priest at the consecration asks the Father to send the Holy Spirit to sanctify the offerings of bread and wine so the consecration can take place. She, along with another participant, shared that during this revival year, she is yearning to hear more about the wonders and the miracles of the Eucharist at Mass regularly!

We found Bishop Barron’s book *This is My Body* enlightening but also challenging for non-scholars so we decided to compliment our reading with video presentations on the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist from u-tube followed by further discussion. U-tube presentations we enjoyed were Fr. Schmidt and Archbishop Fulton Sheen. Finally, we discussed the sacred power of visiting the Blessed Sacrament in our Chapel which is available 24 hours a day.

Theresa Hartmann We have recently completed our group discussion of *This is My Body*. I recruited my family for this discussion group, to include my mom, daughter, son-in-law, husband, sister, aunts and uncle. We all enjoyed getting together and talking about our Catholic faith. Additionally, we all learned new and interesting information about the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Over the period of time we met, we talked about ways in which our perspective had changed and changes made as a result of our study and discussion.

This was really very enjoyable. How good it is to get together with family around a table and talk about Jesus, all He did for us and how good He is! Thank you for the invitation to be part of this activity.

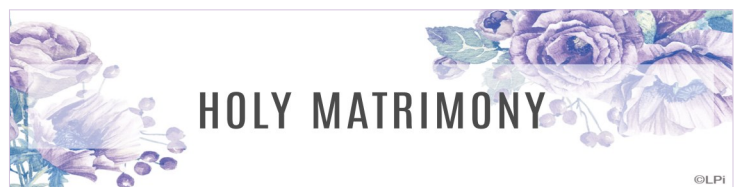

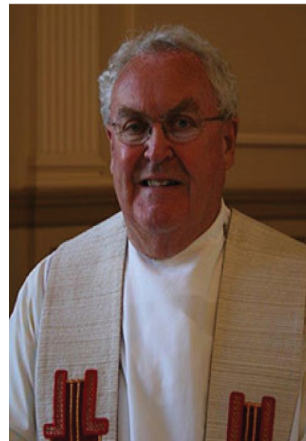

Reflection by Suzanne Alfarah

My name is Suzanne Alfarah. I chose to go to NCYC for a couple of reasons. I have been told by people who have gone that it is amazing, and how much they loved it. And my son was going, and I wanted to be there with him.

It was the trip of a lifetime. There were inspiring speakers, moving homilies by priests and bishops, and great praise and worship music throughout the entire trip. We took breaks for meals and were able to connect and reflect on the talks or performances. We shared our thoughts and feelings about what we took away from each of the different presentations. This helped us by sharing our own perspectives with our group and being able to listen to what they were able to take away from it.

It's hard to put the experience into words. It was an energy in the atmosphere that you felt from everyone around you. To look around at a stadium full of 12,000 young people singing praise and worship to God. Holding hands with one another and kneeling down on the cement floor for adoration of the blessed sacrament.

Father Kartje, president of St. Mary of the Lake/Mundelein Seminary in Mundelein, Illinois was one of the speakers at the convention. He holds a doctorate in Scripture and Astrophysics. He spoke about the theme of the convention, Fully Alive. He gave a great talk about how faith and science do not contradict each other they go hand in hand.

He continued his talk explaining how we could not have science if it were not for God. He made the connection between faith and science as both being ways of looking at the world "one looks at it with the lens of a telescope and one looks at it through the glass of the monstrance."

At one of the masses the bishop actually took the Eucharist out of the monstrance and processed out of the stadium cradling it in his arms to show how precious it is. Showing the kids that it's not the gold monstrance that we are worshipping it is what is inside that we worship and adore.

The closing mass on the last day was also a powerful homily. It was given by Bishop Joseph A. Espallat. He spoke to the young people about so many important topics. He talked about joy over fear. He talked about how we will have suffering, as Jesus did so we should too. But if we have faith, we will still have joy.

I thank God for making it possible for me to have this experience, and even better I was able to share it with my son and grow my faith at the same time helping him grow his faith.

I hope every teen at St. Francis will take advantage of going on the next convention and parents that can join their kids as well you will learn and reignite your faith too. Parents and young adults please make this convention, as well as other youth ministry events, as much of a priority as all of your other commitments. Whether they are sports, academics, or social obligations, making time for Jesus, to practice and strengthen your faith is the most important obligation we have. NCYC is a great way to do that.

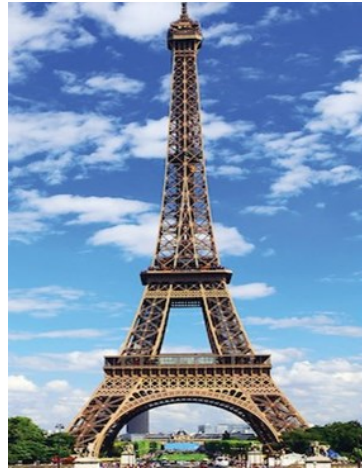
