

MORSELS & TIDBITS FROM OUR PASTOR

Sunday Gospel in everyday English

There once was a man, John, sent by God to point out the way to the Life-Light. He came to show everyone where to look, who to believe in. John was not himself the Light; he was there to show the way to the Light. When Jews from Jerusalem sent a group of priests and officials to ask John who he was, he was completely honest. He didn't evade the question. He told the plain truth: "I am not the Messiah." They pressed him, "Who, then? Elijah?" "I am not." "The Prophet?" "No." Exasperated, they said, "Who, then? We need an answer for those who sent us. Tell us something—anything!—about yourself." "I'm thunder in the desert: 'Make the road straight for God!' I'm doing what the prophet Isaiah preached." Those sent to question him were from the Pharisee party. Now they had a question of their own: "If you're neither the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet, why do you baptize?" John answered, "I only baptize using water. A person you don't recognize has taken his stand in your midst. He comes after me, but he is not in second place to me. I'm not even worthy to hold his coat for him." These conversations took place in Bethany on the other side of the Jordan, where John was baptizing at the time. (from John 1)

Notes on the Scripture

It's the time of year for pageants. Schools and parishes will sponsor them, and many a reluctant or nervous child actor will arrive on cue as Mother Mary or vigilant spouse Joseph, a glorious array of angels or shy shepherds. We'll have three berobed kings too, and that's just the standard cast, but today's scripture is all about John the Baptist.

While not on the scene that silent night, his testimony is a vital part of this season too. When asked about his role, John offers three momentous negations. He's not the Christ-Messiah-Anointed that swells all the rumors of his generation. He's not that guy. And he's not the prophet Elijah, swept up long ago in a chariot toward heaven but never declared legally dead in Hebrew history. Elijah was expected to return as the forerunner of the Messiah one day. Nor does John accept the role of the Prophet-Teacher predicted by Moses in his last speech to the community before they entered the promised land without him. John prefers to attach himself to Isai-ah's legacy. The voice in the wilderness? *He's that guy*. Which leads to the question: what role do you and I play in the pageant of salvation? Where do we stand in relation to that cradle of the world's hope?

Part of the preparation for Christmas is to experience God's love and mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Just like in years past, I invite you to our Communal Reconciliation Service this Monday, Dec. 18th at 7:30pm.

Next Weekend

Every so many years, we experience this happy collision of observances: the last Sunday of Advent blossoms into Christmas Eve in a single day. It's a mad scramble for presiders, preachers, choirs, and liturgists to keep up with the whole, holy mess of these occasions. Please, keep in mind that next Sunday we will only have two morning Advent masses at 8am and 10am (NO NOON MASS). However, in the afternoon there are a number of Christmas Eve masses at 2pm, 4pm and 10pm. Please join us for our beautiful liturgies on this 4th Sunday of Advent, Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.
