

# Sunday Gospel in everyday English

God sent the angel Gabriel to the Galilean village of Nazareth to a virgin engaged to be married to a man descended from David. His name was Joseph, and the virgin's name, Mary. Upon entering, Gabriel greeted her: Good morning! You're beautiful with God's beauty, Beautiful inside and out! God be with you. She was thoroughly shaken, wondering what was behind a greeting like that. But the angel assured her, "Mary, you have nothing to fear. God has a surprise for you: You will become pregnant and give birth to a son and call his name Jesus. He will be great, be called 'Son of the Highest.' The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David; He will rule Jacob's house forever." And Mary said, I'm the Lord's maid, ready to serve. Let it be with me just as you say. Then the angel left her. (from Luke 1)

# Notes on the Scripture

Mary of Nazareth is the most perfect example of what happens when a human being enters fully into partnership with divine life and she is presented to us to-day, on this 4<sup>th</sup> and final Sunday of Advent. The doctrine of Incarnation, which we celebrate at Christmas, is about God-made-human, but it could not happen without Mary. When presented with this decision she is troubled, afraid and has questions, but she declares herself the servant of the Lord. She accepts God's Word, and God accepts hers.

One of the Greek names for Mary is *Theotokos*, or "God-bearer." As one listens to the readings, which speak about the Ark of God dwelling in a tent, and Jesus dwelling in Mary's womb, the question to ask ourselves at this point in Advent is, "Are you ready to bear Christ within? Have you made a home for him in your heart?" Are we ready to say, *Maranatha*; come, Lord Jesus!

# In the early Church

Christmas was actually not a major feast, but over the centuries it grew in importance, and Saint Francis of Assisi catapulted its popularity in 1223 by creating the first nativity scene in a cave with live animals. Christmas Midnight Mass was celebrated there and it was a huge hit with the whole town. The tradition of the Christmas crèche was born. Francis loved Christmas, considering it the "Feast of Feasts," because God chose to take the humble form of a poor baby. Let the wonder of the Incarnation imbue your day. Merry Christmas to all!

# THE EUCHARIST REAL PRESENCE OF JESUS OR A SYMBOL

A PEW research study revealed in 2019 that only 30% of Catholics believe in the Real Presence. Fully two-thirds of those questioned held that the Eucharistic elements are merely symbolic of Jesus' presence. Would you like to join a small study group that will give you the information you need to spread the word that the Church's official teaching is true? Jesus is really, truly and substantially present under the appearance of bread and wine.

Groups of six to seven people or more meet in our Church or in private homes to discuss Bishop Robert Barren's book **This is my Body**. Groups can meet during the day or evening. The discussion usually lasts 1-1/2 hours. We have five groups that are meeting currently or have recently completed the six weeks.

We have another group meeting after the first of the year. Busy with the holidays now? You can join a group after the holidays in January.

Here are comments from three parishioners who have recently completed the study:

# From Kathleen Kocianski

Most of my Catholic formation was done prior to Vatican II. I was taught that when I went to Communion I received Jesus, but nothing about the Real Presence. I was a Sunday/Holy Day Mass-attending Catholic out of habit and obligation, and I received the Eucharist reverently, but not struck with wonder and awe.

Bishop Robert Barron's book <u>This is my Body</u> (a short but mighty book) was very helpful in providing evidence in Scripture and through Church scholars as proof of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. The people in my group were very open and willing to share their thoughts. Our host could not have been more welcoming and gracious. I looked forward to our meetings every week, and I feel blessed that I was invited to participate.

I feel the Lord in my life every day and I know and believe that when I receive the Eucharist, it is food for my soul that sustains me. I hope and pray that the Eucharistic Revival awakens all Catholics to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

## From Maureen Niswonger




# First Friday Devotion, January 5th

# The "Angel Fund"

Each year, across the nation, Catholic schools are recognized at parish masses and with special school events during "Catholic Schools Week." This year, the celebration for our parish school, **Cardinal Joseph Bernardin Catholic School (CJB)**, will begin with liturgies on January 27 and 28. CJB staff and students will also welcome visitors for our Open House and Personal Tours on **January 28 from 11am until 1pm**. Throughout "Catholic Schools Week" special events will be held at CJB – beginning with a mass on January 29 which will recognize and celebrate our volunteers. Additionally, we will celebrate the strong program of faith formation at CJB, our nationally twice-recognized blue-ribbon academics, and the selfless involvement of students and staff in a variety of service projects.

Nine years ago, CJB's founding parishes (St. Elizabeth Seton, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Stephen Deacon & Martyr, and St. Julie Billiart) began a special collection known as the "**Angel Fund**." This collection is taken up one weekend during the year at the start of Catholic Schools Week. The Angel Fund is meant to assist parishioner families who may need a bit of help in sending their children to CJB. Last year, nearly 20% of our students received some type of financial aid from various sources. As you would understand, many families are in need.

CJB is so very grateful to our sponsoring parishes who subsidize qualified parishioner students. With the recent defeat in the Illinois House of the extension of the *Invest in Kids Program*, our school will lose over \$40,000 in tuition assistance for current students who hope to attend CJB next year. **No donation is too small.**Any donation you are able to make is truly appreciated!
